We realize that Diva will not be a good fit for most homes. That's okay—we don't need a hundred applications to adopt her. We just need that one unique basset-savvy person who is able & willing to appreciate the 'diva' in this little girl & to give her the forever home that she longs for & deserves. That one special person will be repaid for years to come with the undying affection of this one-in-a-million sweetheart.

FOSTER TAILS . . . A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN OBR FOSTER PARENT

SOMETIMES SAD. SOMETIMES FUNNY. ALWAYS FULL OF DROOL

In our March/April 2005 Hound Herald, we told you about Thor, a 10+ year old gentleman who came to us blind, in deplorable condition, & with advanced, untreatable cancer. We told you that Thor likely had only 3 months to live, but would do so in the loving custody of dedicated OBR foster parents Will Smith & Marcia Eckstein. Well, all that was true . . . except that Thor has defied all medical expectation & almost 1 yr. later is still with us. And, as Marcia's story below demonstrates, sometimes a step ahead. Marcia writes:

Thor hasn't quite got me trained yet. The other morning, as I do every work morning, I walked through the house calling, "Thor, Hunt, Annie, Lil, Deedle, c'mon, time for a quick run out back. I'm getting ready to leave."

Hunter, Annie, Lily and Sweet Pea emerged from their respective cozy corners but no Thor. "Thor," I called, "Come on, Thor. Just for a minute I promise. I know it's cold out there. I'll let you right back in. Come on now. Thor. Thor?"

No Thor. It was getting late. I had to be at radiation therapy at 7:30 a.m.

"Well, where the heck did he get off to?" I asked the others who were dutifully lined up in the family room.

Annie and Lily wagged their tails ready to play, Sweet Pea looked terrified because things weren't going exactly as prescribed in her contract, Hunt laid back down and tried for a few more minutes of sleep.

I was on the verge of getting worried when I heard a shuffling noise in the kitchen. I rounded the corner with the rest of the pack and there he stood, quietly, his usual dignified self, waiting for his silly human to get a clue and let him out.

A message from **Chloe**:
"Don't forget about me! I need a home too! I'm a pretty little basset/ticked beagle mix & I keep my foster family very entertained. I'm 100% spunk! Please contact my foster mom Kathy Roberts (937-750-9000 or kat-moose@prodigy.net) today. You won't regret it!"

Are you good humored & not afraid of a little dog drool? Do you want to save a hound's life? Become an OBR Foster Parent!

Did You Know?

A little hard work & a lot of patience are the only things standing between you & a well-behaved hound!

If training your hound makes you feel like Napoleon at Waterloo, take heart. You aren't alone, & you can succeed! Consider the following tips:

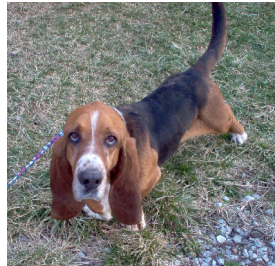
Be Consistent. Have you ever had a boss who was a stickler for the rules one day, while trying to be your best friend the next? Or a boss who seemed to change your job description every time you turned around, so that you never really knew what was expected of you? If so, this experience probably left you feeling distrustful & resentful. Well, what kind of boss are you to your dog? If the rules for your dog change depending upon whether mom or dad is home, or whether you have company, or whether you're in a good mood or not, it's no wonder if your hound is less than obedient. A better approach is to sit down with your family & decide exactly what will be expected of your dog, & get everyone's agreement to enforce the rules in the same way every single time.

Be Persistent. Studies have shown that it takes the human brain 21 days to "hard wire" a change in behavior (try an experiment – move your trash basket to the other side of your desk & see how long it takes before you stop automatically tossing trash to the old spot). So why is it that we expect our dogs to learn new commands in just a few lessons, & then to retain them without practice? If you are serious about training, take time every day (preferably several times a day) to work with your dog on a single command & continue this for a minimum of 3 weeks. Mix it up by introducing the command in different situations. Training sessions of 5 minutes or less, several times a day & over the course of several weeks, provide great reinforcement for your dog & will yield the best long term results.

Practice Positivity. Do you learn well if you are being yelled at, hit or shaken? What would you think of a person who trained his children with negative or violent methods? Then why would you use these techniques on your beloved dog? Rather than focusing on what your dog does wrong, a better approach is to ignore the bad behavior while rewarding the good behavior. Since even the most incorrigible pup hates to be ignored & loves to be praised, this approach will condition better behavior over time. Remember, training isn't a competition in which you try to "catch" your dog in failure. It's a team sport where you & your dog are working toward a common goal. *Want more information about positive training methods?
